

Store employee attempts to deny entry to one not wearing mask:

STORE EMPLOYEE: Gives name or not, but reiterates denial of entry.

CUSTOMER: I know myself to be healthy and not contagious. Unless you can prove that I am contagious, then you have no lawful basis to restrict my entry. This is pure discrimination.
